What is Human Trafficking

Human Trafficking is the process through which a person is deceived or coerced or to recruited into moving from their place of residence to another place where they will be exploited.

The Forms of Exploitation

★ Domestic Servitude

Being forced or coerced to work in a private home with little or no pay, no freedom of movement and often facing abuses.

★ Sexual Exploitation

Forcing or manipulating someone into sex acts like prostitution or pornography, often for money or personal again.

★ Organ Trafficking

It involves the illegal trade and removal of human organs. Victims are tricked, forced or killed for their organs, which are then sold on the black market.

★ Drug Trafficking

Using individuals, often children or young adults, to transport drugs by threat or deception across borders or within a country.

★ Forced Labour

Forcing someone to work under threat or abuse, often in unsafe and inhuman condition, with little regard for their safety or wellbeing.

★ Forced Marriage

Being made to marry against one's will, often through threats or pressure. Victims lose control over their lives and bodies.

★ Forced Begging

Compelling individuals, often children, to beg for money or goods in public places. The money collected is handed over to the traffickers, while the victims receive little to no benefit.



Signs suggesting someone might a victim

- Accompanied by a Controlling Person.
- Unable to Speak Freely or hesitant to share information.
- Shares a Scripted or Inconsistent Story.
- Disoriented or Unaware of Their Surroundings.
- Shows Signs of Physical Abuse.

Talitha Kum Zambia (TAKUZA) is a faith-based national network committed to ending human trafficking. It operates as a project under the Zambia Association of Sisterhoods (ZAS), an umbrella body comprising 45 congregations of religious women active across Zambia.

The name Talitha Kum comes from the words of Jesus in Mark 5:41, where He says to Jairus' daughter, "Talitha Kum" — an Aramaic phrase meaning, "Young girl, I say to you, arise." This powerful expression has been adopted by Talitha Kum International, a global network of consecrated life dedicated to fighting human trafficking. Based in Rome, Talitha Kum International inspires its affiliated networks — including TAKUZA — to embody the spirit of compassion, mercy, and hope. "Talitha Kum" has the

transformative power of compassion and mercy, which awakens the deep desire for dignity and life which may be asleep and injured by the many forms of exploitation.
